WHO CAN TAKE CLASSES?

Classes are available for children ages 5 through 18. The are separated into groups by age.

WHAT ACTIVITIES ARE OFFERED?

Classes are all age-appropriate and designed to build upon previous knowledge. All classes have physical movement, vocalization, pantomime and various theatre games. See the abbreviated curriculum for age-level class contents.

DRAMA PROJECT POLICIES

We want our project participants to have the best experience possible. Please read the policies below. Parents, by signing the registration form you are indicating that you have read and understand the policies below. Discuss these policies with your child so that he or she understands them as well.

WHAT TO BRING:

- Wear comfortable clothing that will allow you to move freely; clothing should not be too tight or too loose—pants/shorts and T-shirts are ideal.
- Shoes should be sturdy and give your feet and legs support—sneakers are good. Flip flops and flimsy sandals are not.
- A water bottle would be great!
- Leave your electronic devices at home (cell phone, CD player, iPod). If a cell phone is a must, then turn it off during class time.

BEHAVIOR POLICIES

- SAFETY is our primary concern for all children and staff. Care will be taken to ensure that behavior is safe.
- STAY WITH THE GROUP. ASK for permission to leave to go to the restroom. Let the teacher know when you are back. One person at a time from each group may go to the restroom.
- The riverbank is OFF LIMITS.
- NO HORSEPLAY pushing, shoving, hitting, slapping and other types of horse play are not allowed. They are dangerous to the pusher–shovers and the innocent bystanders.
- NO HARASSMENT OF ANY KIND. Name-calling, bullying, teasing and other forms of harassment are not appropriate for drama class.
- FOLLOW THE GROUP rules and procedures set by the teacher.

CONSEQUENCES FOR POLICY INFRACTIONS

- Minor infractions will be dealt with in class with a warning.
- Persistent (more than one infraction) behaviors will warrant a call home.
- More than two infractions will cause a child to be removed from camp and parents called to come and take the child home.
- Behaviors that cause danger to the child or to others will result in immediate removal from the Project.

REFUND POLICIES

- Refunds will be made only in the case of serious emergency or illness. If a student must leave class for a family emergency or illness during the FIRST WEEK of class, refunds will be prorated on a \$12 a day basis, up to \$60. NO REFUNDS will be made at any time during the second week of class.
- NO REFUNDS will be made for students who have been asked to leave class for disciplinary reasons.

GENERAL

- The telephone at FDA is a business line and is in use all day for business purposes. Please do not call the theatre with messages for your child unless it is a serious emergency.
- Pick up students within ten minutes of the end of class.
- We cannot supervise children who are not in class.

CURRICULUM

for sessions 1 & 2

CLASS FOR 5, 6 AND 7 YEAR OLDS

"Fun with Books and Words" uses movement, music, rhythm, and sound to explore words and stories. Building and telling stories with a beginning, middle, and end is encouraged.

CLASS FOR 8, 9 AND 10 YEAR OLDS

Activities include movement, vocalization, rhythm, pantomime, theatre games, exploring the animate world. Also includes puppetry, simple scene work, and scene writing.

CLASS FOR 11, 12, 13 AND 14 YEAR OLDS

Activities include movement, pantomime, vocalization, improvisation, staged Reader's Theatre scenes, two and three person scene work, basic characterizations, blocking, scene writing, and monologues.



Sessions 1&2 are limited to 15 students per class; Session 3 is limited to 30 students. Registration is on a first-come first-served basis.
